# Working people want a voice at work 

Fact Sheet • April 21, 2021

There is a huge gap between the share of workers with union representation (12.1\%) and the share of workers who would like to have a union and a voice on the job. As shown in Figure A, almost half of nonunion workers polled in 2017 (48\%) said they would join a union in their workplace tomorrow if they got the chance. That's $50 \%$ higher than in 1995, when $32 \%$ of those surveyed said they would vote for a union.

In addition, a 2020 Gallup poll finds that $65 \%$ of Americans approve of labor unions-the highest percentage in 16 years (see Figure B). And, as shown in Table 1, young adults (ages 18-34) support unions at an even higher level-71\% compared with the overall average of 65\%. ${ }^{1}$
